Father Conrad's Corner

In today's Gospel, Jesus said, "The harvest is plentiful but the laborers are few; pray more for the Lord of the harvest to send out laborers into his harvest." (LK 10:2). Jesus compared His missionary work to a harvest.

Christ's disciples go out as laborers and are "lamb" in their innocence and simplicity. The disciples travel frugally with no extra provisions to distract them; they place their confidence in God's providence.

They greet no one along the way so as not to lose a second in the fulfillment of their mission in the assigned villages and towns; time, for them, is to build the Kingdom of Christ.

The disciples share their stories of conversion and cures. They are caught up in the Lord's work and forget themselves and their fatigue.

Wherever you go, you take the peace of Christ with you also. Offer it to all people with whom you come in contact.

There are many places in our lives where we, too, can be laborers of the Lord.

Sometimes we find ourselves in situations where we work, in our neighborhoods, or with our children's friends where we can show God's love in a single gesture of caring or kindness. Let us show we are followers of Christ by our actions.
